CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Supervisor Pernice called the meeting to order.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the August 11, 2022 Town Board Meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted with a motion by Councilman Purvis and Deputy Supervisor Bump. All in Favor – Carried

SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

- Rescue Squad Data Supervisor Pernice noted that the St. Lawrence County Office of Emergency Services Bureau of Emergency Medical Services has begun furnishing monthly reports on call volume and turnover statistics by Agency. (Norfolk Rescue Squad being one of the agencies on the report)
- New Truck Grant Supervisor Pernice noted that we will be applying for a grant for the next new Highway Department truck (looking to take delivery in 2 years). Budget Officer Bill Dashnaw agreed to assist in that process.

Elm Circle Playground – The new boat has arrived and has been put in place. Playground will re-open early next week.

PUBLIC COMMENT

NNCS Trap team representatives Chris Beckstead and Matt Nolan gave an overview of what the trap team is, membership and how it's organized.

Resident Tammy Murray noted that because of all the water quality issues that she's been having she had not paid anything on her 2022 water bill prior to the June 1^{st} deadline and therefore had received a late fee notice. She stated that due to all the expenses incurred to replace household items ruined by poor water earlier in the year, she would like a credit for the 1^{st} & 2^{nd} qtrs. as well as the \$25.00 late fee. She has since paid for 3^{rd} & 4^{th} qtrs.

Supervisor Pernice responded that water samples had been taken at four other locations on the system (including 2 neighbors very close to her) and all tests came back from the lab as well within limits with no issues reported by those homeowners. It was also noted that as part of the water (hydrant/valve) project completed earlier this summer it was discovered that the water main did not dead end at the end of Fairlawn Ave as suspected but rather loops around back to Woodland Ave at the section closest to the bridge. It was decided to install a new hydrant at since it was all dug up anyway.

Supervisor Pernice offered to have samples pulled from inside the Murray's home as well as the other 2 neighbors around her who she (Tammy Murray) said are having the same issues she is.

* Decision to waive the \$25 late fee was approved with a motion by Supervisor Pernice and Deputy Supervisor Bump. All in Favor – Carried

Town Justice George Grubee brought up the issue of a rat/vermin problem on the section of Wheeler Drive where he lives. This is not a new complaint and Code Enforcement will look into the problem again.
